New 3 T MRI Donated to Health Sciences Centre

During the 2017-18 fiscal year, the Health Care Foundation, in partnership with the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador, completed its journey to secure funding for a new state-of-the-art 3 T MRI. Thanks to the support of Trades NL (\$1 million donation), the Bank of Montreal (\$500,000 donation),

Scotiabank (\$250,000 donation), CIBC (\$120,000 donation) and the Estate of Gordon Butler (\$43,800), the new scanner was successfully installed in May 2018.

"If I could say anything to the donors that helped fund the new 3 T MRI, I would let them know that they have no idea how important their contribution is to patients like me," said Samm Tilley, a multiple sclerosis (MS) patient and frequent MRI user. "This is not just a machine, it ultimately determines someone's life and path to wellness. It gives me great comfort to know that someone is keeping an eye on me."



The 3 T MRI is an incredible enhancement to the current fleet of diagnostic equipment at Eastern Health. Technology is always changing and improving and the Foundation is proud that patients will now have access to the best 3 T model available on the market.

Without the support of our donors, the people of Newfoundland and Labrador would not have access to this incredible machine. Thank you for advancing health care here at home.

Benefits of the new 3 T MRI

It's Extremely Efficient

This scanner can generate high quality images very quickly, allowing shorter examination times. This means more patients can be scanned, which improves access to this service.

Enhanced Comfort for Patients

Patients will be able to listen to music during the exam, which will help create a distraction and reduce anxiety.

Ultra-High Definition Imaging

If a picture is worth a thousand words, the 3 T MRI is an encyclopedia.

Improved Clinical Outcomes

The new MRI will ultimately help improve outcomes and comfort for patients, especially for the diagnosis and navigation of MS, brain cancers, aneurysms, pelvic cancers and prostate cancer. temens ?

New Mechanical Heart Saving Lives


The Health Care Foundation partnered with VOCM Cares to host the first annual Row 4 Heart Radiothon on February 13, 2018 at the Avalon Mall, which raised \$87,863 for the Provincial Cardiac Care Program. This was not your average radiothon - Row 4 Heart was also a heart pumping rowing challenge! Over 120 rowed and pledged for the event, with hundreds of others donating to help raise the funds necessary to purchase mechanical heart technology.

Mechanical heart technology is crucial life-saving equipment for cardiac patients. While the program was equipped with state-of-the art equipment needed for heart surgery, having a mechanical heart allows them to provide care to those patients requiring a bit more help to recover. A mechanical heart helps provide care to patients who require several days of heart support either before or after their surgery. The device is also very portable, which helps those patients who need support when travelling to receive either a heart or lung transplant.

"We are so thankful for the gifts we received from the people in this province to purchase this incredible equipment," said Dr. Corey Adams, Cardiac Surgeon with Eastern Health. "I am happy to report that using this equipment, we saved a young person's life recently. This equipment changed this person's life, and we would not of had it without the help of the Health Care Foundation."

Home Lottery Moves to Portugal Cove - St. Philip's

The Health Care Foundation's Home Lottery continued to generate excitement and raise vitally needed funds in the 2017/18 fiscal year. In May 2017, the Foundation concluded its ninth annual lottery and netted approximately \$600,000 for various adult health care programs.

For the 10th anniversary of the Home Lottery, the Health Care Foundation felt it was time for a change in location. In the spring of 2018, the Foundation launched its first ever oceanfront showhome at 9 Ocean's Edge in Portugal Cove-St. Philip's!

Even with more tickets available than previous years, the lottery was a massive success, selling out by the early bird deadline and netting approximately \$1 million.

So who won the \$1.1 million Grand Prize Showhome with the priceless view? Robert and Ruby Murphy bet the odds and won both the incredible home, plus \$15,000 cash!

Other major prize winners included Roy Naugler who won the Early Bird Prize of a new Jaguar F-Type Convertible or \$70,000 cash. The winner of the largest 50/50 take



home in the lottery's history was John Marshall, who received a cheque for \$247,035!

During the last fiscal year, the General Hospital Auxiliary completed a commitment to the Peaceful Port Project of \$270,000, which helped fund a number of spaces including the transformation of the outpatient clinic area of the Health Sciences Centre.

The drive and determination of the General Hospital Auxiliary is inspiring. We look forward to working with this group for years to come, and supporting them in their journey to improve health care here at home.

The 2017/2018 Year in Review

Supporting Women's Health

The Health Care Foundation continued its support for the Women's Health program this year through its annual Brunch with the Bags[™] event. Thanks to the generosity of sponsors, guests, donors and friends, the Foundation raised \$106,019 for grief and bereavement supports for perinatal loss and gynecological equipment.





Supporting Cardiac Care

On June 15, 2017, the Health Care Foundation held its annual Charity Golf Tournament and Hearty Lunch at The Wilds in support of the Provincial Cardiac Care Program. Thanks to the outstanding support received from sponsors and participants, the Health Care Foundation raised \$\$86,826 for a new portable ultrasound machine and a transport monitor. Additionally this year, thanks to a \$30,000 donation from Avalon Ford, the Health Care Foundation supported the installation of new televisions for the Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit.

Supporting Surgical Care Here at Home

The 2017 Eleganza immersed our guests into an evening of suspense, as they engaged in the classic murder mystery of Clue. The Clue themed gala raised over \$407,992 this year for the surgical program to purchase cell savers, also known as auto transfusion machines. These machines are used to recover and deliver back a patient's blood during procedures where a large blood loss is expected.



Supporting Kidney Care

The Health Care Foundation continued to support the needs of dialysis patients this past fiscal year with proceeds from the third annual Dialysis Dash, held on August 20, 2017 at Bowring Park. Thanks to donors, participants and sponsors, \$82,500 was raised for local dialysis units for a new portable ultrasound machine and a new dialysis machine.





Supporting Comfort for Patient's and Families

The Health Care Foundation was pleased to donate over \$75,000 to Eastern Health during the 2017-18 fiscal year for Comfort in Care™ items that would improve the well-being of patients and residents. This funding helped purchase a number of items, including child representational therapy dolls, pets and musical bears for residents with dementia, a weighted blanket and comforters for the Waterford Hospital and art therapy supplies for hematology and oncology patients. Funding for the Comfort in Care™ program is provided by Johnson Insurance, as well as generated through a number of initiatives including Tree of Memories, Fall Flowers, third-party fundraisers and employee fundraising.

Supporting Mental Health and Addictions

The Health Care Foundation provided \$30,000 for the Moving Lives Forward program in 2017-18, investing in post-secondary education bursaries for those living with mental illness or addiction. We are excited to grow funding for the program in the 2018-19, thanks to a donation of \$45,000 from the Royal Bank of Canada's Future Launch.



Staff Research and Education

The Health Care Foundation continued to support education and research this year through the following initiatives:

Canadian Nursing Association Certification Grants

The Health Care Foundation in partnership with TD Bank Group, continued its commitment to supporting nursing excellence this year. Thanks to a \$25,000 contribution from TD Bank Group, 41 registered nurses were able to complete a Canadian Nurses Association Certification or Recertification, helping them truly become experts in their designated fields.

Staff Scholarship Program

The Health Care Foundation was pleased to award \$10,000 worth of scholarships to five Eastern Health staff in December 2017 in support of further education and development.

Research Grant Program

This year the Foundation donated \$11,839 towards research projects that will help advance adult health care. This year's recipients included projects related to multiple sclerosis and sports related concussive injury.



Planned Giving

Building a Legacy in Health Care

The Health Care Foundation saw an increase in revenue for the Planned Giving program during 2017-18 due to an unexpected increase in bequest gifts allowing us to fulfill the philanthropic wishes of a number of donors. A total of \$319,900 in bequest gifts were made to the Foundation, allowing for improvements in cardiac care, staff education, rehabilitation and long-term care.

Celebrating Gary Rowe's Legacy

Gary Rowe has left an outstanding legacy in health care. When he was still with us, Mr. Rowe was a tremendous supporter for better health care here at home, and he found a way to transcend this commitment for years to come through a planned gift which has supported mental health, Comfort in Care[™], life-saving equipment and so much more. 
