With your help in 2019-2020, we raised \$4,321,672 and made many improvements to the quality of care patients receive in our hospitals and health centres.

Medical equipment and procedures are constantly advancing, and your support keeps your hospitals up to date with these advances. This year alone, we were able to improve the diagnostic abilities of our cardiac care unit, and considerably increase access to dialysis for patients of kidney care.

Your donations also funded equipment to improve thoracic surgery and will mean less invasive procedures for patients in emergency care, urology, and women's health.

With your support we were also able to keep up with the shift worldwide towards "patient-focused care." Our Peaceful Ports™ program focused on improving the comfort of waiting areas and patient rooms in 3 locations at the Miller Centre, the Health Sciences Centre, and the Dr. Walter Templeman Health Care Centre on Bell Island.

Meanwhile, our Comfort in Care™ program provided 63 items, chosen by healthcare workers, that will make recovery easier on their patients, and improve the daily lives of residents in long-term care.

We are also proud to continue making our hospital environments more accesible, more senior-friendly, and better able to provide care to patients with mental illness.

2019-2020 was a record year for many of our key programs and events, and that is a testament of your devotion to better health care in this province. We cannot thank you enough for the difference you are making in our healthcare facilities, and we look forward to doing more great things with you all in the years to come.

Thanks to Fortis, we will be transforming our cancer care unit at the Health Sciences Centre into a comfortable space of hope and healing.

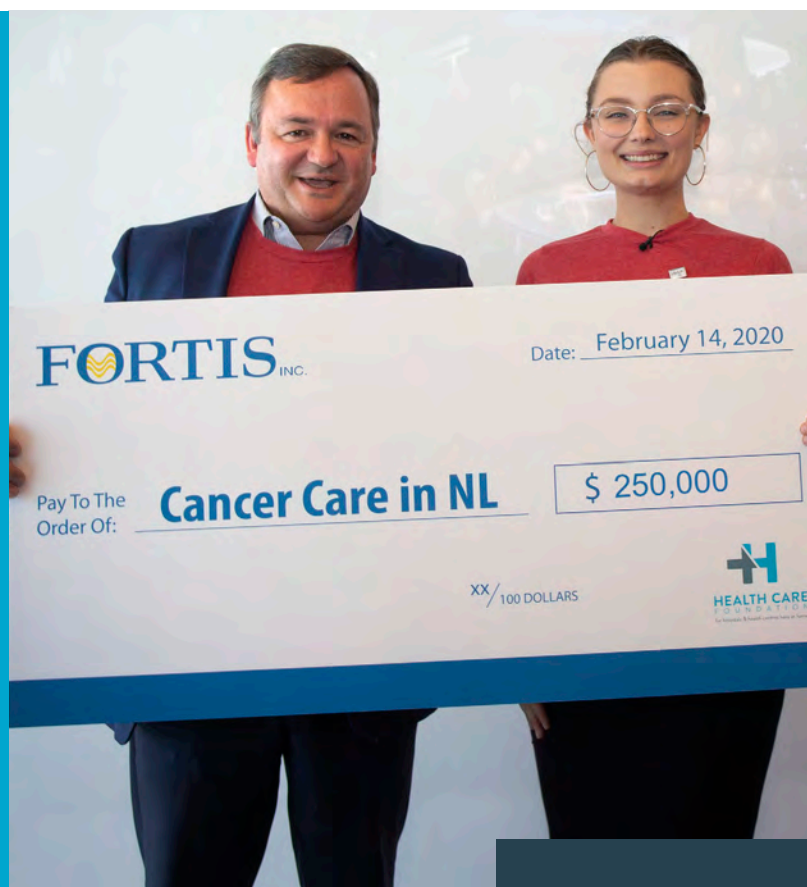

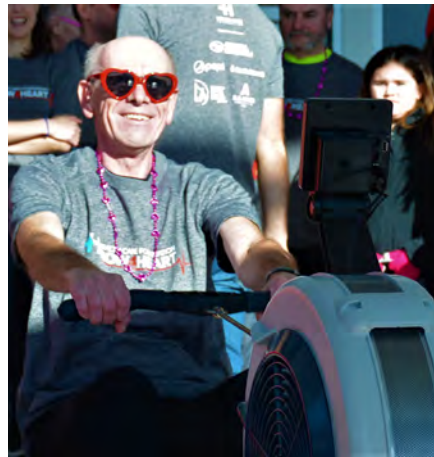
Brunch with the Bags | *Women's Health*

Our annual Mother's Day weekend brunch, auction, and morning of entertainment raised money to modernize the labour and delivery unit with new equipment including fetal monitors and hand held dopplers.

Dialysis Dash | *Kidney Care*

Revenues from this year's fundraising run purchased staxi chairs and a new dialysis machine. These items will help our Kidney Care Centre meet demand for more dialysis appointments.





Row 4 Heart | Cardiac Care

We were able to enlist more teams than ever this year, thanks to Capital Subaru who offered us their large retail space as a venue. Proceeds purchased six new state-of-the art cardiac care recovery chairs which enhance patient comfort and patient transfer during their recovery from cardiac surgery.

Gurney Cup | Emergency Care & Urology

This year's Gurney Cup proceeds were raised for two causes. The Emergency Department purchased blanket warmers as well as a new bladder scanner that can avoid having to use a catheter on a patient. The Urology program purchased a vital signs monitor, and a new ureterscope which allows doctors to remove kidney stones in a minimally invasive manner.

Grants & Education Programs | 2019-2020

Canadian Nursing Association Grants

Nurses are the heart of our hospitals and patient-centered care. We are proud to continue funding specialized training and professional certifications for our nurses so they can continue to provide our patients with superior health care.

Comfort in Care™ Grants

This year's program allowed 63 healthcare workers to purchase comfort items for patients in various units. For example, new way-finding items at St. Clare's help patients with dementia easily navigate their unit and identify their room.

Eastern Health Research Grants

This year's Research Grants funded studies that focus on lowering the complication rates of treatments for Hemodialysis Patients, investigating the link between cardiovascular and reproductive health, and more.

Eastern Health Staff Scholarships

Every year we provide \$10,000 in scholarships to staff in our hospitals so they can keep up to date with advances in their fields, and in turn, provide even better care to our patients.

Moving Lives Forward Bursary Program

Nearly 100 recent clients of Eastern Health's mental health or addictions programs successfully applied for a bursary to pursue higher education.

Peaceful Ports™ Program

We can't change the story, but we can change the setting.



Pauline Head's Peaceful Port Story.

One week before Christmas of 2019, Dad had a massive heart attack. Two doctors told us they did what they could to clear one blockage, but there was a very good chance he would pass within the next 24 hours.

We were shocked and devastated. He had been painting his friend's house the day before because his friend was sick. As we sat crying in the waiting room, a kind man told us of a room around the corner where we could have more privacy.

When we entered this room and closed the door, a calming tone transformed the chaos of the moment into something more manageable. We had our very own tranquil refuge in our time of need.

Throughout that night and into the early hours of the morning, family arrived and we all crowded together in that room. We each took turns visiting Dad in the CCU, and my family stayed in this Peaceful Port for several days, around the clock.

Just days before the heart attack, Dad had said, "Christmas is not what it used to be. Sure, you don't see anyone anymore." The whole time in the hospital, we kept saying he certainly got a Christmas he would have loved: as he was on life support and resting, he had his children, his grandchildren, siblings, nieces, nephews, and old friends all around him.

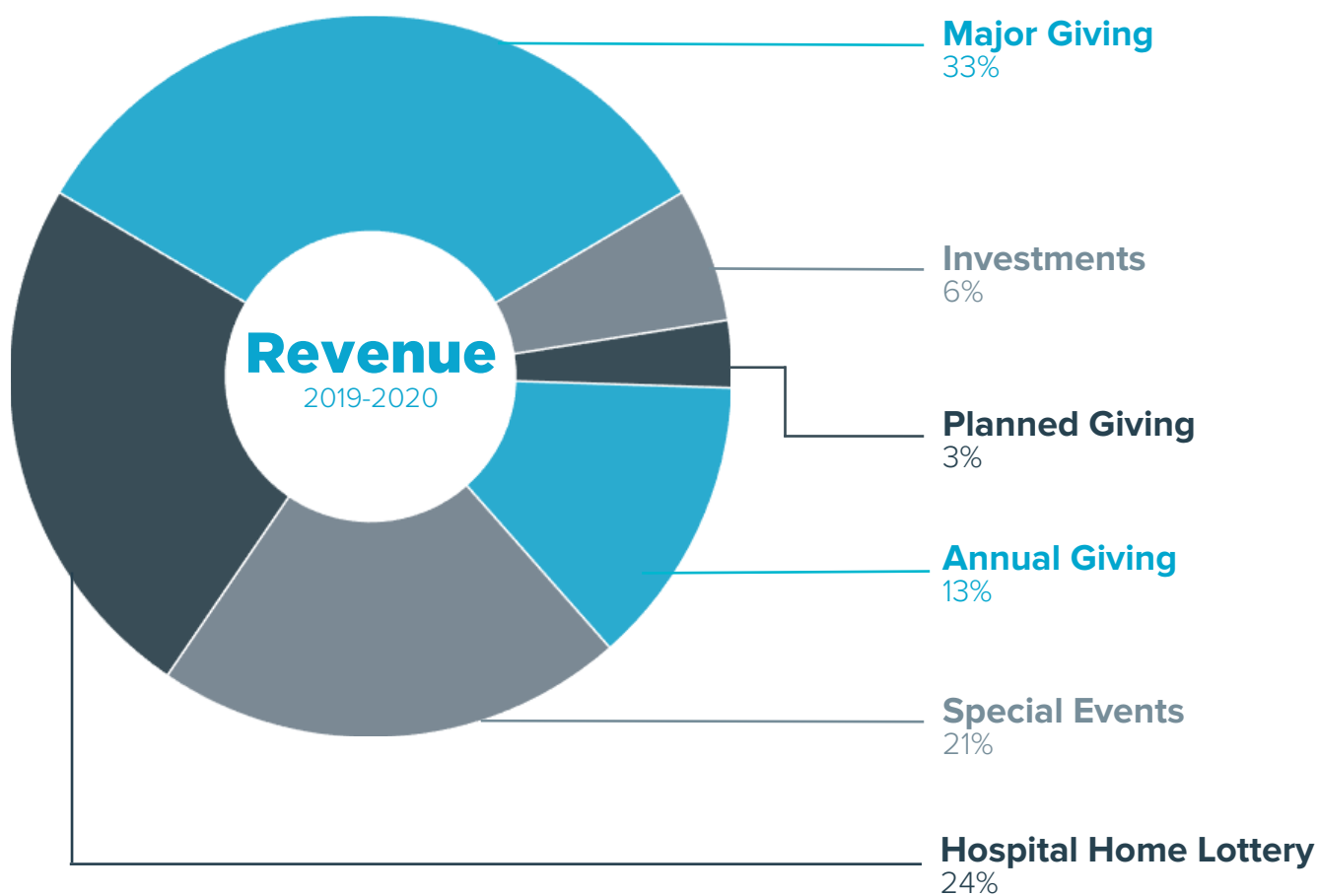
On Boxing Day, Dad took his last breath at 3:30, aged 66.

We thought perhaps a church or cemetery donation in his memory would be nice. Nothing felt right, until we thought about what that Peaceful Port Family Room meant to us, and decided it had to be a donation in his memory to Peaceful Ports.

Thank you, Health Care Foundation, for making our final days with Dad more bearable.

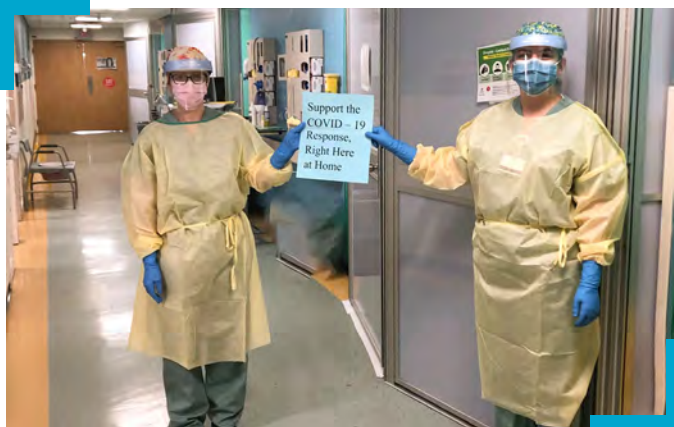

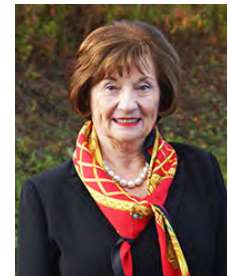
