




2020-2021 Annual Report

COVID-19

This year, our health care workers didn't slow down, and neither did the support from our community.

VERAFÎN

Verafin stepped up to the plate to ensure our COVID-19 unit would be ready for a potential surge in Intensive Care cases due to the pandemic. Together with their employees, Verafin gave \$325,000 to our COVID-19 Response Fund, so we could purchase 15 next generation Progressa™ ICU beds.

These beds will dramatically improve the delivery of care in our ICU for many years to come.





RBC provided \$30,000 in funding to the Rapid Response Team and Psychological First Aid (PFA) facilitator training. The Rapid Response Team addresses the psychological safety needs of employees and physicians by providing opportunities to meet and debrief with facilitators. PFA aims to reduce stress symptoms and assist in a healthy recovery following a traumatic event, natural disaster, public health emergency, or even a personal crisis. This training, along with mentoring and other learning opportunities, leads to a prepared and ready team.

The funding has assisted over 150 teams since the onset of COVID-19.

Your donations purchased locally made personal protective equipment (PPE). While public health restrictions kept patients and their families physically apart, patients still had their loved ones by their side virtually, connected by purchased iPads. Your donations also provided emergency accommodations and meals for staff required to quarentine away from home.

The Health Care Foundation was honoured to serve as a conduit for community donations to the front line, delivering PPE, scrubs, gift cards, food and gift bags. We were truly overwhelmed by your generosity.

Your support allows us to make improvements and advancements to a number of program areas including:

Dialysis \$56,851

We purchased six new Staxi transport chairs, a new wheelchair for the dialysis unit, and a sleeper chair for Veteran's Pavillion. The Royal Canadian Legion donated funds to purchase two blanket warmers for the Department of Veteran's Affairs (DVA) Unit at the Miller Centre.

Integrated Operating Room \$108,959

The Health Care Foundation continued to support the redevelopment of our operating rooms to next generation operating suites.

Women's Health \$88,176

We supported the purchase of four new infant bassinets, two new examination tables and educational materials for the Women's Health program.

Thoracic Surgery \$16,409

A friend of the Health Care Foundation supported the Throacic Surgery unit with a donation of new surgical instrumentation.









IN OUR HOSPITALS AND CARE CENTRES

The Health Care Foundation raises funds to support the Health Sciences Centre, St. Clare's Mercy Hospital, Waterford Hospital, Dr. L. A. Miller Centre, Dr. Walter Templeman Health Care Centre, Pleasant View Towers, Caribou Memorial Veterans Pavilion, Nuclear and Molecular Medicine Facility, and the LeMarchant Mental Health and Support Services Houses.

Each year, your donations make a difference in these sites. We want our hospitals and health facilities to have the latest technology and equipment. We also want to attract and retain the best and most qualified doctors and nurses. It's also important for staff to have opportunities to advance their skills, so they can continue to provide exceptional patient care. The Health Care Foundation supports training opportunities for Eastern Health staff through:

Eastern Health Staff Scholarships

Each year, we provide \$10,000 in scholarships to staff in our hospitals, so they can keep up to date with advances in their fields, and in turn, provide optimal care for our patients.

Canadian Nursing Association Grants

Nurses are the heart of our hospitals and patient-centred care. We fund specialized training and certification for our nurses. This year, we awarded 32 grants totaling \$14,587.



CARDIAC AND CANCER CARE

Amanda's Story

My cardiac journey began when I was 16. At 21, my symptoms worsened, having a greater impact on my daily life. I was sent to my local emergency department, and diagnosed with dilated cardiomyopathy (an enlarged heart. Medically speaking, having a big heart is not a good thing).

That summer I was told I was in end-staged heart failure. The genetics and cardiology teams at the Health Sciences Centre diagnosed me with an extremely rare type of muscular dystrophy known to attack the heart. I needed a cardiac device to help my heart pump until I could get a new heart. In January 2019, I received my heart transplant, and was given a second chance to live.

The staff in the cardiology department of the Health Sciences Centre supported me during my most vulnerable time. They saved my life. There are no words to describe how grateful I am.

Newfoundland Power employees and customers donated \$100,000 to support cancer patients and their families in Newfoundland and Labrador. Their donation will support the Health Care Foundation in renovating and upgrading family and patient rooms in our cancer unit, 4 North A at the Health Sciences Centre. The renovations will help patients and their families while undergoing acute care during hospitalization for cancer treatment, and recovery from cancer surgery.



MAKING OUR HOSPITALS MORE COMFORTABLE

Peaceful Ports[™]

Our Peaceful Ports™ program provides soothing and comfortable spaces for patients and their families in our hospitals.

Surroundings have a major impact on our well-being and mental health. We want patients and visitors in our hospitals to have a comfortable place to recoup, regroup, rest and recover.

Peaceful Port™ spaces are designed with comfort and relaxation in mind. These spaces feature soft lighting, fireplaces, artwork, wifi, comfortable seating, televisions and greenery to create a homelike environment.

We are redeveloping 113 hospital spaces, at an estimated cost of \$5.650.000.

Comfort in Care[™] **Grants**

The Comfort in Care[™] program allows healthcare workers to identify items to make the patient experience more comfortable. This year, we approved 62 Comfort in Care[™] Grants, totaling \$60,000 for our acute care and long term care units.

Your donations purchased comfort items like patient and nurse pocket talkers, Broda chairs (specialty transportation for immobile patients), outdoor therapeutic activities for mental health residents, sleeper chairs, a portable shampoo basin on a stand, iPads and gardening stations.

Moving Lives Forward Scholarship Program

In 2020, with NAPE's sponsorship, Moving Lives Forward became a province-wide scholarship program. We awarded \$30,000 in scholarships to 32 recipients from adult mental health and addictions programs to pursue educational opportunities.

The Moving Lives Forward Scholarship Program allows participants to grow and heal through the pursuit of personal development, skills training and advancing education.

Mental Health Bus

The Health Care Foundation supported the purchase of a \$64,029, 10-passenger bus for the mental health program. The bus is used to provide patients with supervised access to the community, so they can practice life and integration skills. The bus also takes geriatric patients on social outings.

Recovery Centre

We are proud to support the Recovery Centre with \$200,000 in funding toward the redevelopment of the mental health and addictions inpatient facility through our Peaceful Ports™ initiative using proceeds from our home lottery.





Together, we raised \$303,164 for Mental Health.

Bounce Health Innovation (Bounce) was launched in January 2018 to connect frontline healthcare workers with developers, designers, patients and entrepreneurs. Bounce accellerates the growth of the health innovation sector in Newfoundland and Labrador, with the vision to make the province a testbed for medical technology innovation.

Bounce engages with and supports medical innovators and entrepreneurs by leveraging resources within a unique health innovation ecosystem. Bounce brings economic activity and new jobs to Newfoundland and Labrador.

The Health Care Foundation is proud to partner with Bounce Health Innovation. This year, we contributed \$90,000 to local medical innovation initiatives.

Innovation

The provision of health-care services requires a complex blend of concrete knowledge and innovative thinking on all levels. In health care, innovation means thinking critically and creatively to solve problems while also managing the day-to-day operations of programs and facilities and the delivery of quality care and comfort to patients, clients, residents, and their families. 2020 HEALTH CARE FOUNDATION HOME LOTTERY



The Health Care Foundation Home Lottery oceanfront theme continues to be a wonderful success with our 2020 home, built by MacIntyre Homes, in Kingfisher Estates.

Our 2020 Health Care Foundation Home Lottery was the most successful in our history. The lottery sold out before the bonus deadline of May 15. This was the earliest sellout of any hospital home lottery in Canada. This early sellout maximized our revenue and minimized our expenses, resulting in a net revenue of \$1.3 million!


